Total workplace immersion facilitates a seamless combination of classroom instruction, career exploration, and relevant job skills training through strategically designed internships.



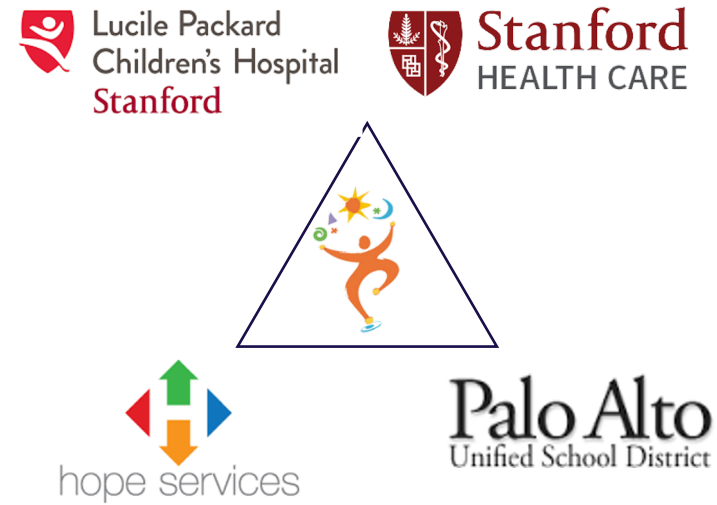

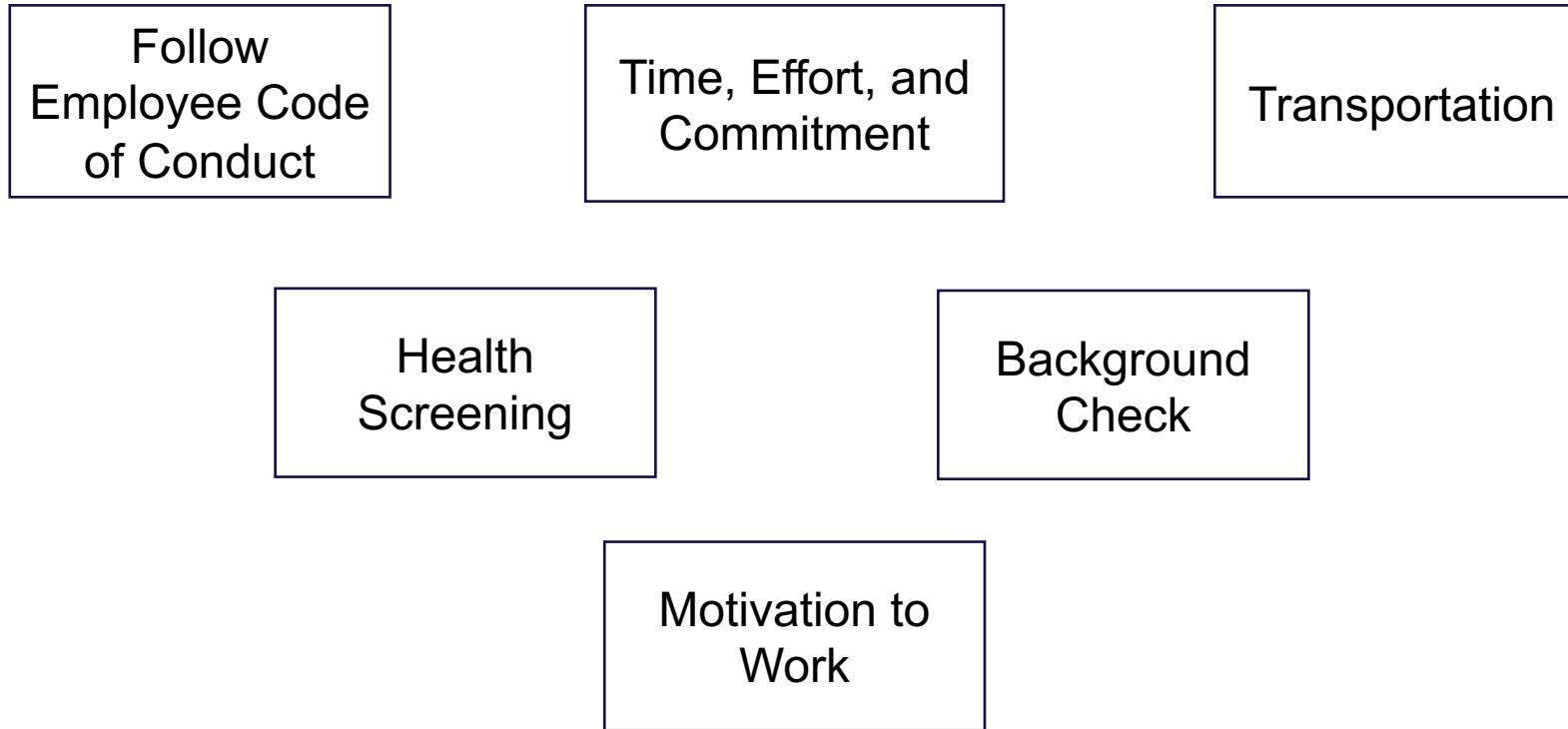

What is the application process?

- Get basic information about the candidate's background, interests, and support needs in an employment environment
- If selected for an interview, candidates will be asked to provide more detailed information
- A parent, student, counselor, teacher or employer may be contacted by the Selection Committee to gather additional information

Selection Criteria (Program Eligibility)

- Be at least 18 years of age, a recent graduate or in their final year of school with district
- Meet eligibility requirements for DOR services
- Meet eligibility requirements for Regional Center
- Good personal hygiene and grooming skills
- Once trained, be able to independent in the hospital setting for short periods of time
- Maintain appropriate behavior and social skills in the workplace
- Take direction from instructor, transition staff, mentor or supervisors and change behavior as needed
- Able to consistently attend a full school-day (6 hours) for a full school year
- Able to adhere to the host business' standards of dress and professional conduct
- Able to be trained to travel independently to job sites
- Have previous experience in a work environment
