## How does ignite outreach and inform parents and students of services?

- Ignite team host transition workshops in 7th & 8th during AP/AC/TS/Extensive Needs classes.
- Transition Specialist give presentations at the beginning of each school year to AP/AC/TS/Extensive Needs classes to discuss the supports available.
- Ignite team attends site special education department meetings to share upcoming events
- Case Managers invite our team to present or request a vocational workshop.

- Attend parent information meetings like CAC, Transition Night, Back To School Night.



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
